C. CERTIFICATION PROGRAMS

- 1. Review, discussion and action regarding approval of Progressive Healthcare Training Center nursing assistant training program: R. Colosimo reminded the Board that A Progressive Healthcare Training Center (APHTC) was approved by the Board in June 2011 for a nursing assistant training program and College of Southern Nevada (CSN) as the program's academic administrator. She explained to the Board that board staff was contacted by CSN regarding APHTC student complaints. On July 31, 2013, a meeting with board staff, Carla Wright from CSN and Paula Anderson from APHTC was held at CSN. During this meeting CSN was informed by APHTC that classes were held in June and July. CSN was not aware of these classes being taught which is a violation of the contract between CSN and APHTC. P. Anderson informed Board staff that APHTC was currently behind financially and they would begin a class on August 5, 2013. Board staff advised APHTC that they would be required to meet with the Board prior to teaching any additional classes. On August 9, 2013, a second meeting was held at the Board office with Board staff, Deborah Ain and C. Wright from CSN, and P. Anderson and Bobbie Vaughn from APHTC. P. Anderson confirmed that APHTC was in arrears by approximately \$70,000 to the CSN finance department. She also informed the group that three groups of students had attended courses that were not authorized by CSN. One group of students was registered through CSN; however, their tuition, although paid to APHTC, was never paid to CSN. As a result, these students cannot register for future classes or obtain official transcripts with their earned college credits. The second group of students completed classes that were never registered with CSN, so they never received certificates of completion from CSN. APHTC sent student records to CSN and C. Wright was able to confirm that these students successfully passed the course. Board staff provided certificates of completion for those students so they could begin the certification process with NSBN. The third group of students paid for the nursing assistant training program at APHTC but never began the course. APHTC closed shortly after July 31, 2013. It was moved and seconded the Board withdraw approval of A Progressive Healthcare Training Center nursing assistant training program. MOTION CARRIED.

E. EDUCATION

1. Review and discussion regarding the NCLEX first time pass rates year-to-date for CY2013: R. Colosimo presented the year-to-date NCLEX first time pass rates for 2013. She highlighted Great Basin College with a pass rate of 100% and Nevada State College with a pass rate of 98%. R. Colosimo added that most of Nevada's fully approved programs are doing well. She also provided the pass rates for Nevada's provisionally approved programs including: Breckinridge School of Nursing at ITT at 44%, Kaplan ADN at 67%, Everest College at 91% and Nevada Career Institute at 85%. The Board was concerned with Touro University's current NCLEX pass rate of 80% and requested that Touro University attend the November 2013 Board meeting.
2. Review, discussion and action regarding Nevada Career Institute request for practical nursing curriculum change: Connie Carpenter, Jean Lindley and Adnan Al Mouazzen from Nevada Career Institute (NCI) presented the revisions to the curriculum. Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN) requested that the amount of credits in this program be reduced to reflect national standards for practical nursing programs. The current curriculum consisted of total 60 credits and the revised curriculum will be 40 credits. The program will change from 4 terms to 3 semesters to avoid overlapping of faculty teaching and allow time off between semesters. The new curriculum will be implemented by February 2014. R. Colosimo added that various nursing programs within Nevada may be revising their curricula based on nursing accreditation standards providing that practical nursing program be a maximum of 40 credits, associate degree nursing programs have between 60 to 70 credits and baccalaureate programs have 120 credits. C. Carpenter concluded that there will be several plans for faculty development including seminars, case studies, simulation lab and faculty meetings. R. Colosimo confirmed that NCI has had a fairly stable faculty. It was moved and seconded the Board approve curriculum change and conduct a site survey in one year. MOTION CARRIED

3. Review, discussion and action regarding Kaplan College, LPN program report regarding the use of OB simulation: Katherine Cylke, Lily Gonzales and the new campus president Lisa Moore presented the report on the use of OB simulation in their LPN program. R. Colosimo explained that due to most acute hospitals not hiring LPNs there is difficulty obtaining OB clinical experience for LPN students. The Board approved the use of OB simulation for clinical one year ago. K. Cylke also presented the report to the Education Advisory Committee and the other practical nursing programs valued the data and may propose similar curriculum changes for Board approval. R. Colosimo added that during NCSBN's Education Consultant conference call withdrawing OB from the NCLEX-PN was discussed. T. Smyer was impressed with the structure of the simulation and asked that NCLEX scores on the 33 participating students be reviewed. It was moved and

- ACTION seconded the Board continue approval for OB simulation for Kaplan College, LPN program. MOTION CARRIED.
4. Review, discussion and action regarding Kaplan College, ADN program NCLEX first time pass rate: K. Cylke and Richard Angelastro presented the proposed corrective action plan. The first cohort graduates achieved a 100% NCLEX pass rate the second cohort dropped to 70%. There was a faculty meeting to assess the drop in the NCLEX pass rate and a corrective action plan was developed. K. Cylke provided possible reasons for the low NCLEX pass rates including the blended format of didactic being delivered online and on ground, not requiring admission tests for some students and faculty not using Kaplan Test Prep properly. The corrective action plan will include faculty offering extra support with NCLEX preparation for its past and present students. R. Colosimo explained that ACEN will not accept Kaplan College for candidacy status with its current pass rate and they currently have about one year to achieve national nursing accreditation. K. Cylke anticipates that the NCLEX pass rates will be above 80% by the end of the year. It was moved and seconded the Board accept the corrective action plan and a report be provided to the Board at the January 2014 Board meeting. MOTION CARRIED.

VanBeuge reminded the Board that the mission of the Nevada Advanced Practice Nurses Association (NAPNA) is to support the development of APRNs in Nevada. Currently, NAPNA has 300 active members. The biggest accomplishments made by NAPNA last year include, assisting with the passage of AB170 and providing two successful continuing education events for Nevada’s nurses. She added that NAPNA will begin planning for the 2015 legislative session and will also hold two continuing education events in 2014. She concluded by thanking the Board for always working closely with NAPNA.

PUBLIC COMMENT: Kathy Apple, CEO for National Council of State Boards of Nursing spoke during public comment. She explained that she is impressed with how our Board members ask questions and deliberate with each other before making decisions.
