CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order by M. Johnson at 1:00 p.m.

PUBLIC COMMENT: M. Johnson thanked the simulation sub-committee for attending and participating.

A. APPROVAL OF MINUTES: November 22, 2021, minutes were approved as written.

B. OLD BUSINESS: None

C. NEW BUSINESS:

1. Review, discussion, and possible action related to the goals and objectives for the simulation sub-committee. The sub-committee discussed, collaborated, and provided edits to the goals and objectives. The goals and objectives were reviewed and approved. **MOTION CARRIED.** The sub-committee decided to review 1-2 goals and objectives at each meeting. The following are the updated goals.

Nevada State Board of NURSING

1. Raise the level of quality of the simulation in the state of Nevada.
2. Introduce Inter/Intra professional simulation in the state of Nevada.
3. Share information with schools to help everyone.
4. Use the foundational resources for interprofessional simulation.
5. Assisting programs and faculty with simulation certification and accreditation.
6. Provide Standardized of definitions related to simulation.
7. Utilize Inter and Intra professionals as a means for students to learn to communicate with other people.
8. Develop a tool kit. (Resource Guide)
9. Providing examples/resources, stepping stones, positive reinforcement, and collaborative resources.

The following are the updated objectives.

1. Establish utilization of inter/intraprofessional simulation within and between healthcare programs.
 2. Analyze national trends related to the use of simulation in the Nursing Education Program.
 3. Develop recommendations for guidelines for simulation.
 4. Define different types of simulation.
 5. Define the appropriate utilization of Simulation hour ratios (1:1 vs. 1:2) based on evidence-based practice.
 6. Establish resources that can be used by all Nevada nursing programs.
2. Review and discussion related to the National Simulation Guidelines for Prelicensure Nursing Programs. The committee had questions about the policies on the use of simulation and simulation instruction. M. Johnson advised the committee that the Nevada State Board of Nursing (NSBN) policy states that simulation is up to 50%. Also, the NSBN policy states, “The simulated clinical experience must be administered by an individual who has documented formal training or certification in simulation per national evidence-based guidelines.” M. Johnson shared an article from the National Council for State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) providing information about the primary simulation guidelines.
 3. Review and discussion related to the National Council for State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) Model Acts related to Simulation. M. Johnson shared and presented information regarding the model acts and rules. The committee agreed to use the sections and headings from the model acts as a guide for a tool kit.
 4. Review and discussion related to interdisciplinary simulation. M. Johnson introduced Dr. Heather Peralta from the University of Central Florida (UCF) School of Nursing. Dr. Peralta was awarded an Interprofessional Education Collaborative (IPEC) award, works in an Accredited Simulation Center at UCF, and operates an interprofessional clinic for UCF. Dr. Peralta shared her experiences with simulations with a local clinic in Central Florida that offers, physical therapy, social work, pharmacy medicine, and nursing. Also, she indicated the medical model that she follows is from The Certified Healthcare Simulation Educator (CHSE). Dr. Peralta advised the sub-committee of an up-coming Medical Blueprint from CHSE via zoom.

5. Review and discussion related to Certified Healthcare Simulation Educator (CHSE) certification and Society Simulation in Healthcare (SSH) Accreditation. The overall goal is to have at least 1 certified Simulation Accreditation in Nevada. V. Walker provided the sub-committee with a resource list that included; CHSE, SSH, code of ethics, road map, etc., to assist with further research with the goals and objectives.

D. Recommendations for agenda items for the next meeting to be held on April 8, 2022

1. Review and discuss the simulation resource list.
2. Review and discuss the NCSBN Act to build a tool kit.
