**Call to Order:** The meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. on Wednesday, May 22, 2024.

## A. Board Governance and Administration

1. Approval of the March 20-21, 2024, Board meeting minutes: Approved under the Consent Agenda.
2. Review, discussion, and possible action regarding FY 23/24 Goals and Objectives: Approved under the Consent Agenda.
3. Review, discussion, and possible action regarding NSBN Staff/Board conference/training report. Approved under the Consent Agenda.
4. Executive Director Report. C. Dinauer provided updates regarding Business and Industry SB431 regarding combining and consolidating all the occupational boards, CNA glucose finger sticks, and the July 17<sup>th</sup>, 18<sup>th</sup>, and 19<sup>th</sup> board meeting will be held in Lake Tahoe at Zephyr Point discussing the current construction issues with parking and the staff are strategizing to help resolve the parking issues.
5. Review and discussion regarding Scope of practice questions by board staff for the third quarter FY 2023/24. S. McCord presented the agenda item and discussion included the following: Overall calls, when compared to prior year decreased from 233 to 151. APRN practice calls at 59 were most commonly related to patient care specific to surgical procedures in the field of aesthetics and cosmetic procedures, practice of telemedicine from other jurisdictions. Questions related to hormone therapy, population focus and scope of practice for FNPs were also common questions. RN practice calls at 57 related to cosmetic procedures, telemedicine interventions, and endotracheal suctioning, administration of paralytics and the nurses' role in bio feedback interventions. LPN at 24 were significantly less than the prior year. The most common LPN calls related to IV Regulations, scope of practice of an LPN with IV certification, and meeting Nevada training requirements if certified in another jurisdiction. CNA practice question calls remained the same at 8 and addressed CNAs transporting patients to the bank, scope of practice when working in hospice settings, CPR certification requirements if employed in a SNF, CNA to patient ratios, supervision requirements in Home Health. S. McCord provided data as to the resources that were provided to callers including citations of practice laws, practice decisions, referrals to appropriate agencies and NSBN publications. RN supervision of CNA duties.
6. Review, discussion, and possible action regarding update to add Licensed Practical Nurses to NRS 632.474 Pronouncement of Death by a Registered Nurse and NRS 440.415 Pronouncement of Death by a Registered Nurse, Physician Assistant: Conditions; Release of Body; Regulations to include Licensed Practical Nurses in the list of individuals who can pronounce death. C. Dinauer presented the agenda item and discussion included the following: adding LPNs to the list of individuals who can pronounce death, but this is not signing a death certificate, survey results show support of adding LPNs to whom can pronounce death. F. Olmstead provided information related to attending the Funeral and Cremation Services Board meeting providing information regarding: the long-term care facilities, nursing homes, and assisted living facilities who are in support. Hospice agencies don't usually employ LPNs, so many do not have an issue. It was moved and seconded to approve and provide support. MOTION PASSED.
7. Review and discussion regarding Legislative update. C. Dinauer presented the agenda item. Mike Hillerby was present and provided updates regarding the following: He discussed the Nurse Licensure Compact (NLC) which currently has no path to move forward in the 2025 Legislative session. This is due to the on-going opposition by the nursing unions and lack of majority

support. He discussed the CRNA bill in which CRNAs want to be under the APRN umbrella. C. Dinauer thanked Mr. Hillerby for all the work that he has put into the NLC.

8. Review and discussion regarding acknowledgement and appreciation of Patty Towler's 30 years of service with the Nevada State Board of Nursing. C. Dinauer presented the agenda item and presented Patty Towler with a plaque representing 30 years of service with NSBN and a Proclamation from Governor Lombardo of Nevada. Patty Towler provided an appreciative statement. Fellow colleagues provided words of appreciation and thanked P. Towler for the years of service.

If the Respondent violates any of the terms and conditions of this order, the board may take other appropriate disciplinary actions. Respondent is not eligible for early termination of this order. documenting attendance, submit self-reports in writing to the board on a quarterly basis, Respondent shall submit information regarding employment at all potential job opportunities which require a nursing license prior to commencement of work, the direct supervisor submit a job description with initial report, Respondent only work day and evening shifts which end prior to midnight, may not work for a nursing registry, home health agency, travel agency, and a temporary agency float pool or in any on call status, may not function as a supervisor, including as a head nurse or charge nurse, must notify the board in writing within 72 hours of a termination of any nursing employment for any reason, may not have access to controlled substances during employment, Respondent shall be financially responsible for all requirements of this order, including financial assessments by the board for the cost of monitoring compliance with this order, if the respondent violated any of the terms and conditions of this order, the board may take other appropriate disciplinary actions, and Respondent is not eligible for early termination of this order.
