BOARD MEETING MINUTES

September 17-18, 2025

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. on Wednesday, September 17, 2025.

Public Comment:

- Cathy Dinauer introduced and welcomed University of Reno, DNP student Lonnie Jones.
- Carla Doran, Board member, provided information regarding the CNA Train the Trainer class. C. Doran's discussion included 60,000 nurses registered in Nevada but only 119 are licensed to teach a CNA course. The Train the Trainer course will be offered at College of Southern Nevada and Great Basic College this month. Truckee Meadows College will conduct the class in December. The information will be on the NSBN website.
- Cheryl Maes, Board President, introduced and welcomed her online DNP student Amber and welcomed all students attending online.

A. Board Governance and Administration

1. Approval of July 16-17, 2025, Board meeting minutes: O. McGuinness pulled the minutes from the consent agenda. O. McGuinness' discussion included requested verbiage to be added regarding her recusal and removal of evaluation. It was moved and seconded the Board approves the July 2025 Board Meeting Minutes as written with no additions or changes. MOTION PASSED.
2. Review, discussion, and possible action regarding FY 2024/2025 Goals and Objectives: Approved under the Consent Agenda.
3. Review, discussion, and possible action regarding NSBN Staff/Board conference/training report. Approved under the Consent Agenda.
4. Executive Director Report: C. Dinauer presented the agenda item. C. Dinauer acknowledged and thanked Rich Sturek, CTS and R. Hernandez for their efforts in assisting with resolving technical IT issues during the statewide cyberattack. The Las Vegas office is scheduled to move October 1st. C. Dinauer thanked the Board members who attended the Annual Meeting in Chicago, attended the delegate assembly, and represented Nevada very well. Finally, C. Dinauer received inquiries regarding the possibility of NCLEX being proctored online coming out in 2026. National Council has put some FAQs on their website. C. Dinauer requested that any questions, be forwarded to her.
5. Review, discussion, and possible action regarding AI policy for NSBN. C. Dinauer presented the agenda item. Discussion included the State of Nevada Governor Technology Office (GTO) policy regarding use of AI. C. Dinauer recommended approval of NSBN Policy for AI that mirrors Governor Lombardo GTO policy on AI. It was moved and seconded to adopt and follow the Artificial Intelligence policy as presented. MOTION PASSED.
6. Review, discussion, and possible action regarding the submission process for the NSBN newsletter. C. Dinauer presented the agenda item. M. Johnson's discussion included the process of writing the newsletter and contributions. No action taken.
7. Review, discussion, and possible action regarding revision to the Pearson Test of English passing scores. C. Dinauer presented the agenda item. G. Trujillo's discussion included Pearson Test passing scores, statistical information, and how it would affect test takers. It was moved and seconded to accept the revision of the Pearson Test English passing scores to an overall cut score of 56 and a minimum speaking score of 63. MOTION PASSED.
8. Review of the revised FY 24/25 Human Resources report. Approved under the Consent Agenda.
9. Review, discussion, and possible action regarding possible amendment to regulations found in Nevada Administrative Code Chapter 632 in response to the enactment of Assembly Bill 319

which allows Advanced Practice Registered Nurses to supervise Medical Assistants. C. Dinauer presented the agenda item. F. Olmstead led the discussion which included the AB 319 bill regarding APRNs supervision and delegation to Medical Assistants, what procedures can be delegated, and the regulation process. It was moved and seconded to accept the concept and wording of a possible regulation amendment as presented. MOTION PASSED.

10. Review, discussion, and possible action regarding FY 2024/2025 annual statistics. C. Dinauer pulled the agenda item from consent. C. Dinauer's discussion included updated statistical information regarding education department annual statistics and was provided to the Board members. The updated data will be included in the annual report. It was moved and seconded to approve the agenda item and the additional documentation that was provided. MOTION PASSED.

It was moved and seconded to accept the Agreement for Reprimand and Probationary Requirements with an Active/Restricted Licensure status for three (3) years for violation of NRS 632.347 (1)(g) unprofessional conduct, NAC 632.890 (14) performing or offering to perform the functions of a licensee or holder of a certificate by false representation, and (27) customary standards of practice. MOTION PASSED.
- g. Ferreira, Alexis, LPN 873455: K. Arguello presented the agenda item. A. Ferrira was not present. Kathryn Edwards, witness was present, provided a statement, and answered questions. It was moved and seconded to order for Revocation for a period of 2 years for violation of NRS 632.347 (1)(g) unprofessional conduct, NAC 632.890 (18) when Respondent diverted supplies, equipment or drugs for personal or unauthorized use, and (20) when Respondent inaccurately recorded, falsified or otherwise altered or destroyed records. MOTION PASSED.
- h. Leon, Alexander, LPN14531: K. Arguello presented the agenda item. It was moved and seconded to accept the Voluntary Surrender in Lieu of Other Disciplinary Action for violation of NRS 632.347 (1)(b)(2) guilty of any offense: related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a licensee or holder of a certificate, in which case the record of conviction is conclusive evidence thereof. MOTIONPASSED.
- i. McLaughlin, Kamika, RN869082 and APRN869082: F. Olmstead presented the agenda item. It was moved and seconded to approve for closed and open sessions. MOTION PASSED. It was moved and seconded for Suspension of licenses until the Respondent comes before the board to show proof of competency for violation of NRS 632.347 (1)(g) unprofessional conduct and NAC 632.890 (4) when Respondent assumed duties and responsibilities within the practice of nursing if competency is not maintained or the standards of competence are not satisfied, or both. MOTION PASSED.
- j. Quiroz, Maria, RN 833929: F. Olmstead presented the agenda item. C. Perry, attorney, was present and requested a continuance to a future board meeting. It was moved and seconded to continue the matter to a future board meeting and place the Respondent's license on inactive status. MOTION PASSED.
